Causeway hours to change

Starting Tuesday, Oct. 25, residents, contractors and others with valid re-entry passes will be able to cross the Sanibel Causeway from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. This aligns with the curfew in effect on both Sanibel and Captiva, and will be in effect going forward.

Essential vehicles will be able to access the Causeway after 9 p.m., which will allow debris removal and other crucial services to operate around the clock. Private traffic attempting to access the Causeway to exit the island will be stopped by police for questions.

The plan to allow only essential traffic on Mondays and Tuesdays is still scheduled to take effect Oct. 31. You can find out all the other Causeway traffic rules and requirement online at

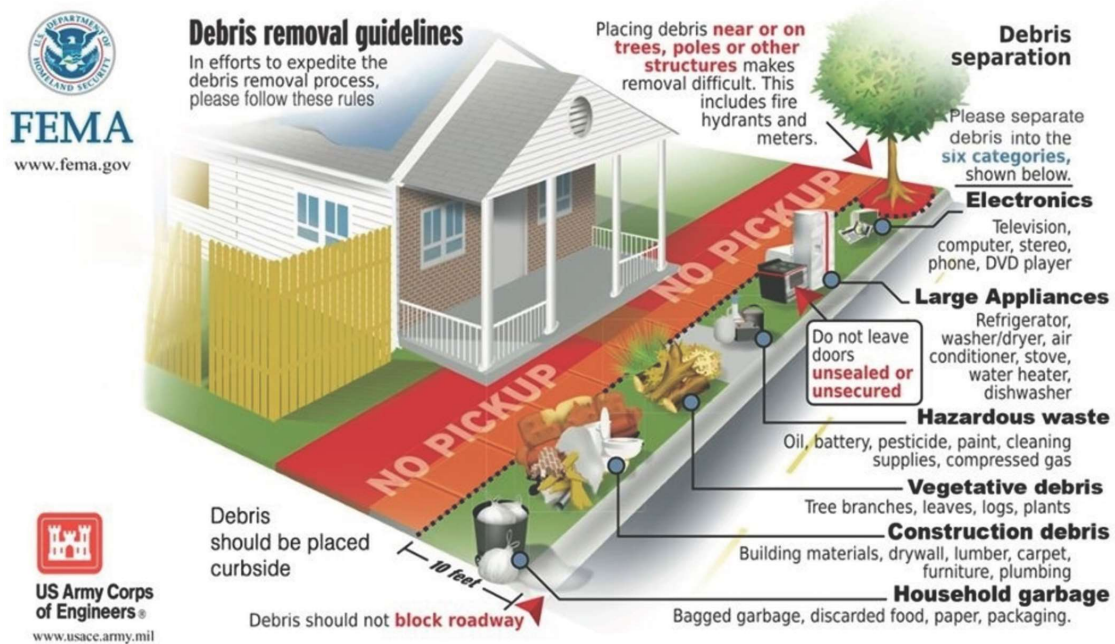

Debris pickup on Captiva under way

Crews with CrowderGulf, the county contractor tasked with post-Ian debris removal, will expand debris removal to all of Captiva starting Tuesday, Oct. 25. Vegetation debris will be stockpiled on the island, while Construction &

Demolition Debris (CDD) will be hauled off-island for disposal.
